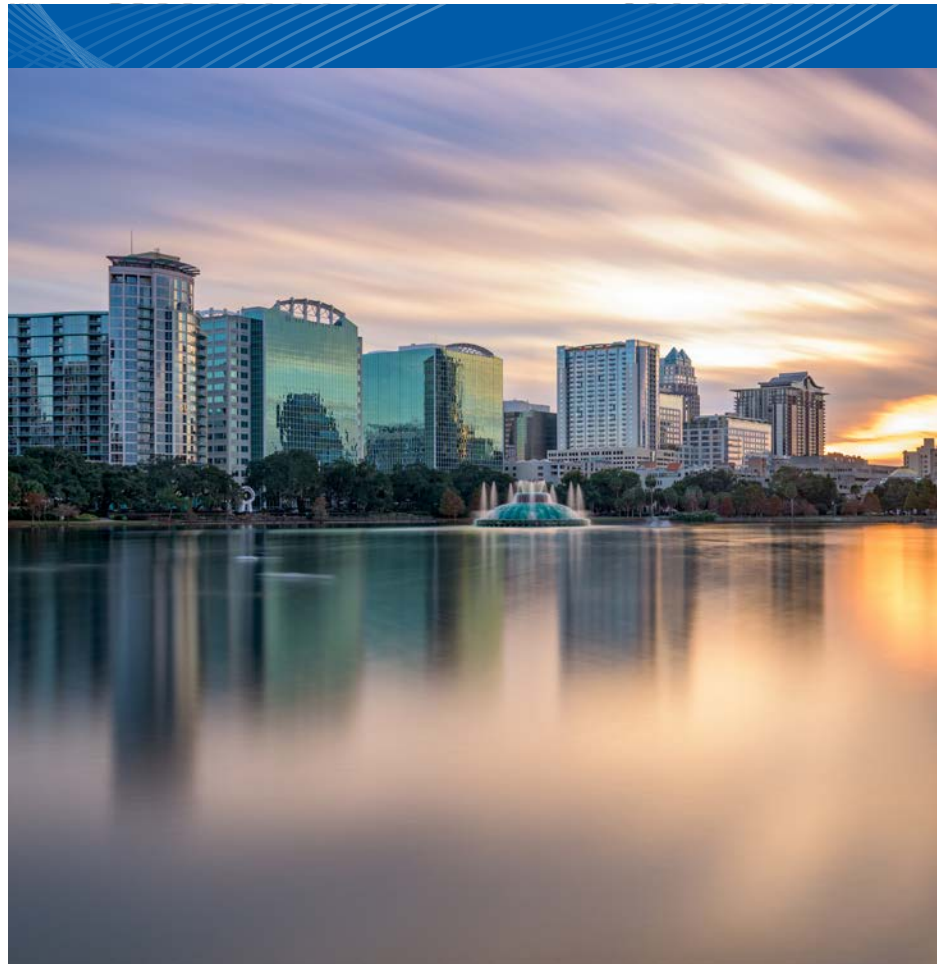

Popular neighborhoods around Orlando for young families include the following:

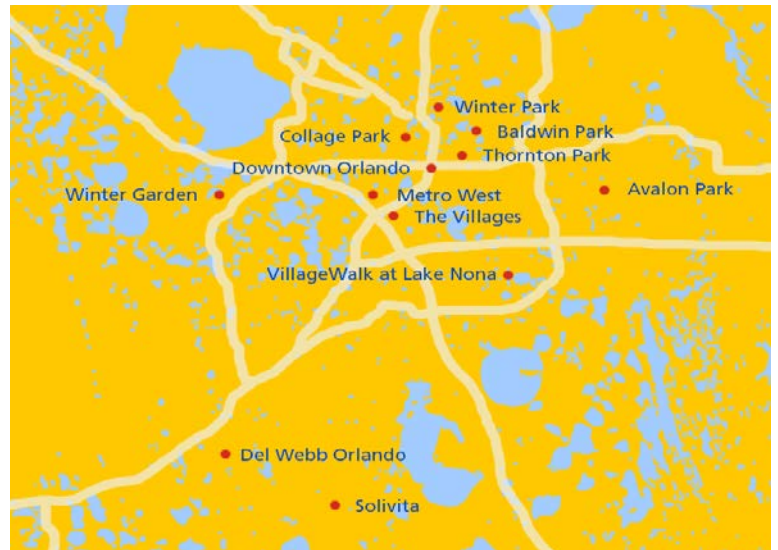

Museums

Orlando Museum of Art

The Orlando Museum of Art features permanent collections of American, African and ancient American art as well as rotating exhibits. The museum is open Tuesday through Sunday and offers programs for youth, families and adults. To learn more about the museum's current collection, visit www.omart.org.

Morse Museum

Located in Winter Park, the Morse Museum features the world's most comprehensive collection of works by Louis Comfort Tiffany, best known for his impressive stained glass works, many of which are on display in the museum. Mennello Museum of American Art

The Mennello Museum of American Art features a permanent collection of paintings from artist Earl Cunningham, a renowned 20th-century American folk artist. The museum showcases American art from all genres and time periods and is a Smithsonian-affiliate museum. Orlando Science Museum

Kennedy Space Center

Winter Park Playhouse

The Winter Park Playhouse is Central Florida's only professional musical theatre, providing performances ranging from musicals for the family to cabarets. Casual Dining
